Small Group Outline & Discussion Questions

Celebrate and Care:

Have each person share a high and low from this past week.

Review:

God's steadfastness is greater than our uncertainty.

Open Up:

Which part of God's creation inspires you the most: the ocean, the mountains, living beings, or something else?

Discuss:

Choose one or two questions for your group to discuss as time allows.

- ▶ Read Romans 8:38-39. On a scale of 1-10, with 1 being unsettled and 10 being certain and resolved, where would you put yourself right now? What has this crisis revealed in your heart?
- ▶ Pastor Matt said, "God's instructions are not trying to take something from us but give something to us." Which of the five outcomes offered in Psalm 19 do you need most right now?
 - Reviving the tired soul.
 - Simplifying the complex.
 - Bringing joy not sorrow.
 - Making your path clear.
 - Bringing justice for all.
- ▶ What practices do you use to settle your soul in these uncertain times?
- ▶ Read Philippians 1:6. What does it give you to know that God is still completing a work in us all?

Engage:

Spend 1-2 minutes in silence with these questions then share your thoughts.

Read Psalm 19:14. The words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart indicate where my trust is. What is one way your words and/or thoughts are aligning with the steadfastness of God and one area you could release to him?

Pray:

Ask God to show how he is steadfast in these uncertain times.
