Small Group Outline & Discussion Questions

Celebrate and Care:

Have each person share a high and low from this past week.

Review:

There are 2.5 billion Christ-followers in the world. If each one lived a life of loving like Jesus, think about the kind of impact that would have on bringing the kingdom of heaven to earth.

Open Up:

Have you traveled outside of the US? How many countries have you been to? What’s the most interesting thing you have eaten?

Discuss:

Choose one or two questions for your group to discuss as time allows.

- ▶ What point or story did a Global Partner make that shifted your perspective?
- ▶ Jesus instructed us to love our enemies. Enemies is a strong word that we might think doesn’t apply to us. How would you describe an enemy?
- ▶ What makes the Good News, good news?
- ▶ Think about a time when you experienced undeserved grace or extravagant love. Describe how this impacted you.
- ▶ In Pastor Chris’s message he said, “The hope of our kingdom not being of this world is not foremost focused on our future escape from the world, but our present hope that we can change the world. Our citizenship is in heaven, but our mission is on earth.” How does this impact your everyday life?

Engage:

Spend 1-2 minutes in silence with these questions then share your thoughts.

Ask the Lord to bring to mind someone that might be your “enemy.” What would it look like to love them this week?

Chris shared 3 action steps we can all take: Pray, Give, Do. Which of these is a step you can take this week and what would that look like?

Pray:

Ask God to show you how you can bring the kingdom of heaven to earth in your workplace, family, and other places you go.
