Small Group Outline & Discussion Questions

Connect:

Have each person share a high and low from this past week.

Consider:

You can find confidence in the midst of questions, and it begins with searching for the truth about Jesus.

Choose one or two questions for your group to discuss as time allows.

- ▶ Read Matthew 11:1-6. What might John the Baptist have been expecting Jesus to be like?
- ▶ What areas of your life were you fairly confident in until you experienced their reality?
- ▶ Read Psalm 73:1-3. What are some doubts or feelings people may have when circumstances don't line up with expectations?
- ▶ How does asking questions as a quest differ from asking questions as a test?

Commit:

Spend 1-2 minutes in silence with these questions then share your thoughts.

Read Hebrews 10:35-36. What is something you need to choose to step over and not allow your faith to stumble over?

Care:

Read Psalms 73:16-17 and Psalms 119:105. Ask God for wisdom, confidence, and security in the midst of whatever you are facing in your lives.
