Jesus restored Peter by addressing three specific areas: <u>Pride, Regret</u>, and <u>Comparison</u>.

Proverbs 16:18 (MSG)

1. The God of restoration <u>pursues</u> us when we fall.

Matthew 26:31-35

- 2. The God of restoration gives us <u>grace</u> to deal with regrets. *Luke 9:23-24*
- 3. The God of restoration invites us to <u>follow</u> him as a way of life.

Connect:

Each person shares a recent high and low from their life.

[For new groups – have each person share a little about themselves – their name, where they are from, a little bit of their faith story, and how long they have been going to Worship Center].

Explore:

What is God saying to you through this message?

Big Idea: Jesus came to restore our lives, and invites us to follow him.

Choose one or two questions for your group to discuss as time allows.

- Read Proverbs 16:18. Pastor Matt said, "Pride misguides." What are some of the lies that pride tries to get us to believe?
- What motivates God to pursue us when we fall? What are a few mindsets that keep us from running to him when we fall?
- Read Matthew 26:31-35. Think about a time when you said, "I will never..." to something, but then you did it. What is God's heart toward you in regards to that time?
- How is talking about our God of restoration relevant in our culture?

Activate:

Spend a moment in silence to consider your response, then share your decision with the group.

How have you seen that God is pursuing you where you are at?

Read Luke 9:23-24 & Philippians 3:9-10. What is one step you could take to share his pursuit of you in a way that others would know his restorative love?

Pray:

Thank God for the highs shared and lift up the lows.

Use popcorn prayer this week by asking each person to take turns saying a word or phrase as a prayer.
