## **Connect:**

Each person shares a recent high and low from their life.

#### **Explore:**

What is God saying to you through this message?

**Big Idea**: Unity in Scripture never means everyone thinks exactly alike, but is rather found in diverse people uniting around a common goal. Scripture encourages us to build bridges rather than bomb them, thereby making choices towards unity rather than the natural human tendency of separation.

#### Choose one or two questions for your group to discuss as time allows.

- Read John 17:20-21, 23. How would you define unity?
- How can we learn from people with differing views?
- Read Philippians 4:2. If you were Euodia and Syntyche, how would you feel hearing this call out in public? How does this inclusion in scripture show the weight of unity?
- Read Philippians 2:2-4. If we lived this passage out in our daily lives, how could we be attractive to the world? And if we don't live it out what does that say to the world?

## Activate:

Spend a moment in silence to consider your response, then share your decision with the group.

Ask God if there is someone you should be building a bridge toward? Is there a step you want to take this week?

## Pray:

Thank God for the highs shared and lift up the lows.

Pray the benediction prayer Pastor Chris prayed.

Jesus, the Great Physician, I want to intercede on behalf of the church. You know our imperfections, our flaws, and our problems. Help us to unite under Your banner and to put aside our squabbles.
